

Disclosed Information:

- 1. The number of employees and FTE of police prosecutor positions in each region (North, North West, South) as at the date of the request.**

<i>Southern</i>	24.21 (FTE prosecutors) includes Inspector – in addition 6 FTE Coronial Division
<i>Northern</i>	14.7 FTE (does not include an Inspector)
<i>Western</i>	14 FTE (does not include an Inspector)

- 2. The number of current vacancies of police prosecutor positions in each region (North, North West, South) as at the date of the request.**

<i>Southern</i>	1 FTE
<i>Northern</i>	0 FTE
<i>Western</i>	0 FTE

- 3. The number and FTE of employees employed as police prosecutors who are currently on extended leave (more than 4+ weeks) as at the date of request.**

Prosecution Services does not record this specific information as a matter of practice. I can advise however, that the two southern travel times recorded above were for the same matter in the northern region, once for preparation and once for the magistrate's court hearing. The western travel was to northern region also, however no other specific information is available.

The PLO travelled on 17 October 2023 to the northern region to prosecute a matter as the Northern Prosecution Services lawyer was appearing as a witness.
