Overview

1 Overview

1.1 Purpose

In consideration of current fires, and based on the resources available, it may be necessary to prioritise the fires in the landscape for their ongoing management and resource tasking. This document summarises the background conditions, methodology and results that have informed the current ranking of the fires across the state.

Please note: this is a live list – new incidents will be added and fires may be removed. This document will be updated regularly, please ensure you have the latest version.

1.2 How the rankings are to be used

The rankings in this documents have been undertaken using the National Emergency Risk Assessment Guidelines as a guide.

It is not an absolute value, but is to provide guidance in order to determine between low, medium and high priority areas for activity.

The rankings on this list are based on data received by 1000 16 Jan. 19 2019

Local Incident Controllers may need to adjust the order in their area, as they give consideration to operational challenges, specific local conditions, and changes in fire behaviour in their area.

2 Risk Assessment

2.1 Approach

An application of the NERAG risk assessment guidelines was made to consider both the consequence and likelihood of each fire (National Emergency Management Committee, 2010. *National Emergency risk Assessment Guidelines*, Hobart: Tasmanian State Emergency Service).

Consequence was assessed using impacts to life, critical infrastructure, the environment, major tourism/public administration and social setting. The analysis was largely done as a desktop assessment using state wide geospatial data. However, where appropriate relevant subject matter experts have been consulted to ensure appropriate consideration is being given to the values.

Likelihood scoring considered the location of the fire in the environment, proximity to flammable vegetation types (from TasVeg 3.0 - DPIPWE (2013): Tasmanian vegetation monitoring and mapping program. Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and Environment) and the current size of the fire. Overall risk was then calculated by multiplying consequence and likelihood.

Consequence

Aligned to the Tasmanian Emergency Risk Assessment Guidelines, 3 = Catastrophic; 2 = Major; 1 = Moderate

Distance criteria ignore <u>unlikely</u> wind directions for a significant fire run (e.g. southern/southwest Tasmania: NE, E, SE, S).




